Universalists Convention Notes

Mrs. Harvey Mitchell of Kinston, vice president of the Universalist Convention of North Carolina Inc. called the session to order at 10:20 a.m. Friday morning. Rev. M. W. Cobb led a devotional with Mrs. W. H. Skeels at the piano. Mr. Graham Dozier, chairman of the Rocky Mt. Chamber of Commerce, expressed a generous welcome to the dele-

gates and stated that he was interested in making Rocky Mount more hospitable to many Conventionists in the future.

President J. A. Ward of Rose Hill presided. Delegates from Clinton, Kinston, Outlaw's Bridge, Red Hill and Rocky Mount were present at the opening session.

The business of the Universalist Church was discussed and plans for future programs outlined. Each Church presented a detailed report of work during the past year.

Rev. J. H. Morgan gave a report of the newly organized Unitarian Church in Charlotte.

In the afternoon, Rev. P. E. Giles, Director of the Unified Appeal of the Universalist Church of America, addressed the N. C. Association of Universalist Women.

an outcome of two nations engaging in a power struggle. "In a power struggle, both nations are potential aggressors" he declared. While each nation, Russia and the U. S. claim to be protecting its own security and while each is convinced that it is right, the power struggle has developed into a third world war. The U. S. support of the unpopular leaders such as Syngman Rhee has weakened the position of this nation's moral leadership in the world. The prospect of a long war ahead of us spells suffering and sacrifice. Even though it is too late to avert such disaster and destruction at this point, there is a real hope that from the suffering of the peoples of the world a government of peace may be established. This would be possible only when we are prepared to eliminate conditions of extreme poverty, disease and insecurity among peoples around the world. Upon these conditions Communism has

thrived and will continue to do so as a result of the destruction of another war warned Mr. Morgan.

The women voted to continue their Institute Days this year.

On Friday evening Mr. Morgan preached the Occasional sermon. He recalled the two historic "means" as an answer to the great problems of today. International wars and national injustices must be met by the "pure means" of "turning swords into plowshares and spears into pruning hooks" and Amos' prophetic statement "Let righteousness roll down as water and justice as a mighty stream." Rev. P. E. Giles led a Communion meditation. Rev. L. C. Prater presided at the Communion service.

During the coming year the State Convention will have as its president Mrs. Steve Wilkins of Rose Hill; vice presidents are Mr. John Miller of Rocky Mount, Mrs. Harvey Mitchell of Kinston, and Mr. William Nelson Outlaw of Seven

Spings; secretary is Mr. Earl Matthews of Clinton; treasurer is Mr. P. T. McLean of Kinston. New trustees elected is Mr. James Ward of Rose Hill.

The Youth heard Mrs. Steve Wilkins at their morning session speak on "What Universalists Believe" and at the afternoon meeting Dr. Lee Brooks spoke on "Emotional Growth". They elected Mr. Alonzo Outlaw of Outlaw's Bridge as their dean for 1951 and Rev. M. W. Cobb of the University of North Carolina as his assistant and adviser. They presented Mr Cobb with a gift in appreciation of the work that he has done with and for them in the past year.

Rev. Giles delivered the final sermon of the Convention using as his subject "The Vehicle of Our Faith."
