A nationwide pell limit com-pleted by the National Federa-tion of Independent Business on this issue, and others, reveals 4% for; 50% against; 6% unde-cided.

These thousands and thousands of ballots, sent as usual directly to Congressmen, are causing many a solon who voted these powers to the President embarassment.

The rapid, severe price jumps have burt small businessmen even more than consumers.

But apparently there is a reluctance to jump from the frying pan into the fire.

It is felt if government had shown competence in dealing with detense, taxation, other grave matters, there would be more confidence in government intervention in the domestic economy.

"What has the greater destruc-tive power—the present infa-tionary trend which may be stopped by American common sense—or burestopped by American common sense or bureaucratic meddling which once started may never make sense, or never be stop-ped?" This attitude of small businessmen might be the most significant vote of no confidence yet registered.

On the same ballot independent businessmen voted almost unantmously for a law that will require co-operatives to pay a fair share of taxes.
