

Home Demonstration Clubs Cooperate 51' Hi-Way Safety Program

 Raleigh, N. C. — The Department of Motor Vehicles will carry its highway safety program into 2,400 home demonstration and 2,400 4-H clubs next year, Department officials reported today.

The North Carolina Agricultural Extension Service is cooperating in carrying out the proposed program.

Each 4-H club will be furnished a map of the county in which it is located, together with simplified

accident reporting forms and colored stars, to represent different types of motor vehicle accidents, fatalities and injuries. An accident report will be filled out on each accident occurring in the county and a star will be placed on the map to locate the accident.

A highway safety skit has been prepared for presentation at a club program early in the year to launch the project. Suggestions will be made for all projects such as posters, scrapbooks on accidents, surveys of highway hazards in the county and programs in chapel and before community clubs.

If the clubs wish, a highway patrolman will appear at a club meeting later in the year to discuss his work and explain the functioning of the patrol radio system. The Department feels that appearance of a patrolman at club meetings will enable the boys and girls to make friends with the patrolman and learn that the patrol is on the highways for their protection.

Home demonstration clubs will act as sponsoring clubs for the 4-H groups wherever possible and will assist them in carrying on the highway safety project.

Representatives of the Department have appeared at district planning meetings of extension agents during the past month and have received support of the agents in the new project.

The farm group is involved in the highest number of fatal accidents of any occupational group.
