All Day Program To Mark Kinston's First Harvest Festival Saturday

The first annual Kinston Harvest Festival will be held Saturday, November 11th, with a full day of events planned from morning 'til midnight. All activities of the day and night are free to the public except the cost of lunch. The day is sponsored by the Kinston Chamber of Commerce.

The day was prepared by a special committee with Robert F. (Bob) Grady serving as chairman. The festival includes a Beauty Contest, 4-H Club Achievement Day Exercises, a Floral Street Parade, a Parade, and a Dance to

merce, stated that a large crowd is expected with fun for everyone. The day's activities will begin at 9 a.m. Saturday in the old Knott Warehouse with agricultural, educational and industrial exhibits.

The official opening of the Harvest Festival is 10 a.m. with a Radio Stage Show featuring the Bailey Brothers String Band of Station WPTF, Raleigh. A Band Concert will follow the show. Guest of honor for the day, Carl Goerch, editor of The State Magazine, Raleigh, will make an address.

A Floral Street Parade is scheduled at 11:30 with colorful floats, clowns, bands, and the entrants for

the title of Miss Harvest Festival will participate in the procession. The Lenoir County Home Demonstration Clubs have prepared and

will serve lunch at 12:15.

The afternoon schedule will begin with a Purebred Hereford Cattle show and sale in the New Carolina Warehouse.

The 4-H Club Achievement Day program is at 2:30 in the Old Knott Warehouse. More entertainment and a stage show are planned during the afternoon.

At 8 p.m. Miss Harvest Festival will be selected from the many entries from seven counties and crowned in a special coronation ceremony in the Old Knott Warehouse. To Miss Harvest Festival will be given \$100 or free transportation to Miami, to the runner-up \$50, third place gets \$25, and a special gift goes to each contestant.

The Kinston Harvest Festival will conclude with a round and square dance which will last 'til midnight in the Old Knott Warehouse.

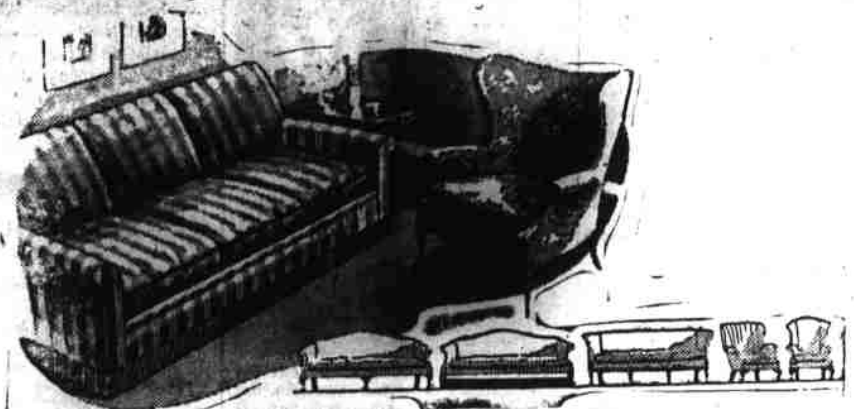
