Duplin will receive as part of the Bond Project 23.98 miles of surfacing on the following sections of county roads and school drives in Calypso, Warsaw and Magnolia: from the end of pavement north of Calypso to Wayne Co. line; from Faison south to Sampson Co. line; from Henry Jones through Bowden to Sprunt Hall; from NC 24, 0.6 miles east of Warsaw to Lanefield church; connecting colored school with NC 24; from Brice's Store via Concord church toward Delway to Sampson Co. line; from Corinth church east to Wellstown Road; from Teachey west to Wallace-Rose Hill Road; connections to school

Calypso with high school in Warsaw, a Grammar school in Warsaw; connecting Magnolia with US 117.
