Annual county supervisor elections for all counties organized into soil conservation districts are being held during this week, according to J. F. Doggett, soil conservationist at State College.

Polling places are open at stores and other community centers thru out 89 counties in which elections will be held. In each county, one supervisor will be elected for a three-year term.

All farmers and farm owners who are registered as qualified voters within the county are eligible to vote.

The county board of supervisors is composed of three members, with the term of one member expiring each year. It is the responsibility of the supervisors to represent the county in soil conservation work at the district level.

The board also urged new industries to additional whose rates are lower, and cooperation with the Federal Government in its attempts to preserve democracy in all areas of the world.

The resolution said that "the Government of the State of North Carolina should gear its spending to current revenue receipts, limit its building program to funds on hand, and refrain from considering any increase in taxes or alteration in North Carolina tax structures."
