The unvarnished truth is that a trained dog is a perishable commodity. Few things are so subject to deterioration.

What are some of the things that contribute to this deterioration, especially the controllable human factors? High on every professional trainer's list is over-discipline.

Dogs differ in the amount of punishment they need, or can take. A word of disapproval here may have as much effect as a whacking there. Never give a dog more than that particular dog needs. It's the inevitability of punishment, rather than the severity that counts, anyway.

Ordinarily the more mature a

dog is the less he will suffer from being unattended. His habits are more fixed, his responses more stable and predictable, and is less likely to deviate from the conventional pattern of behavior. Therefore, give a boy an old dog to hunt. They won't hurt each other. The same advice applies to all inexperienced gunners.

A good way to ruin a dog is to talk him to death while he's trying to hunt. Many hunters are forever giving their dog instructions, delivering lectures and preaching sermons, telling them where and how to hunt. In other words, telling the dog how to run his own business and befuddling him when he gets instructions which run counter to his nose and judgment. Another bad habit of some dog owners is running to a point and being excitable in general. Many a fellow bulls his way through the underbrush like a juggernaut, whooping and shouting a mixture of threats and advice, trying to steady his dog's nerves by making a damned fool of himself. No wonder the dog simply gives up.

State College Answers Timely Farm Questions

Q. Large sweetgum trees are interfering with the growth of better quality trees on my farm. What steps do you recommend?

A. Poison with Ammate crystals placed in a notch or cup cut into the tops of roots or root swells at the ground line. One tablespoonful of the dry crystals should be placed in each notch or cup. Trees should be left standing 6 months to give the chemical a chance to kill the root system completely.

Q. How can corn smut be controlled?

A. Crop rotation and sanitation are the only available means for reducing the amount of infection.
