Because They Don't Make Enough

Most North Carolina farmers fail to pay state income taxes simply because they don't make enough money.

Mann, who is general manager of the Farmers-Cooperative Exchange and the N. C. Cotton Growers Association, said the average Tar Heel farmer's income still leaves much to be desired even though farm prices have taken a turn for the better in post-war years.

At the same time, Mann added, land holdings among individual farm owners are comparatively small, the average farm in this state having under cultivation less than 25 acres.

He said further: "The farmer is a businessman in the same way a merchant, for instance, is. If a business doesn't make enough money after deducting yearly operating expenses, it doesn't pay income tax."
