Millions of Free Bicolor Lespedeza Seedlings Available

The Wildlife Resources Commission still has half of the five millions of bicolor lespedeza seedlings produced in State-owned nurseries and elsewhere available free of charge to farmers and landowners who wish to plant it for wildlife food.

Seedlings may be obtained in lots of 1,000 free of charge for planting in food strips 15 feet wide and 500 feet long. Early planting is desirable and seedlings are ready for immediate shipment prepaid or individually delivered. Persons wishing to obtain seedlings should contact the N. C. North Carolina Boy Receives T. B. Research Fellowship

Funds donated to the National T. B. Association by friends of the late Donald Barr, former executive of Young & Rubicam, Inc., Advertising Agency, have been used to establish a Fellowship for research in tuberculosis, in memory of Mr. Barr, according to Dr. Esmond R. Long, director of medical research of the National Tuberculosis Association.

Mr. Barr died of TB in Tucson, Ariz. in September 1949, was a native of St. Cloud, Minn. He was advertising manager of the Birds Eye Division of General Foods Corporation, and later became vice president in charge of marketing.

The Fellowship has been awarded for the current year to Glen Roy Gale of Durham, N. C. who will study under Dr. Frederick Bernheim of Duke University. Mr. Gale, whose special interest is bacteriology, is planning to do research on the metabolism of the TB germ.

This fellowship is the second to be established by the N. T. A. from special memorial contributions.

The first was in memory of Charles Hartwell Cooke of Asheville, N. C.
