Scott's store community farmers are switching to seeding Dixie Bright 101, black shank and Granville wilt resistant tobacco seeds.

W. E. Waller said, "I for one am going to change over. Last year when plants were scarce, I got some from down near Kinston. I used it to fill out my allotment and noticed that the section planted with those plants showed signs of both the diseases. I'm playing safe this year."

Remus Outlaw, and Jasper Herring are two more farmers of that area switching to the resistant type of plant. "It's so easy for the disease to spread. They tell us that it hits worse the second year," Waller said.
