Legislative Summary

CONTINUED FROM FRONT
 upward revision of state employees' salaries. Not as optimistic, however, the assistant director of the budget has questioned the wisdom of increased spending without providing additional revenue sources. Following the recommendation of its permanent improvements subcommittee, the joint committee voted to recommend that \$150,000 previously allocated to the State be reverted to the general fund. A delayed action on \$794,940 appropriated for state parks until another subcommittee can determine whether the funds have been frozen by federal regulations. Action on the 1947 \$1 million appropriation for a state art gallery was postponed until the subcommittee considers the whole budget bill in its report.

Propositions and Grievances
 The time-honored House committee bearing this name on Thursday gave HB 196, which would submit to the people an all-or-nothing referendum on liquor, beer, and wine, an unfavorable report by an unannounced vote. A long-shot attempt by proponents to take the bill from the unfavorable calendar, initiated on Friday and postponed to Tuesday, is not conceded much chance of success. The final determination in the House will probably decide the fate of a liquor referendum in the 1951 General Assembly, despite the 2 referendum bills still to be acted on in the Senate. As watchdog of the public morals the House committee has also received 2 other bills (HB 453 and HB 469) aimed at outlawing pari-mutual betting at the Morehead City and Currituck dog tracks or anywhere else in the state. One of these bills would also ban bingo games in which prizes are offered to the winners.

State Taxation
 The finance committees are still busy with proposed amendments to the Revenue Bill. They have approved a measure to reduce the gross premium receipt tax on domestic companies writing workmen's compensation insurance in order to give them the same favored position enjoyed by other local insurance companies. A Revenue Department plans to increase the percentage of intangibles tax retain-

ed for administrative purposes met with committee disapproval, as did a proposal to cut from 3 to 2 years the time merchants must keep sales tax records. Rep. Umstead and others are seeking to raise some \$1 1/2 million annually by upping wholesale sales tax rates from 1-20 to 1-5 of 1%. These representatives have also proposed a plan to raise the maximum sales tax on a single article from \$15 to \$30 -- a proposition on which a hearing has been called for March 8. Mr. Umstead may withdraw his demand for a 3% gross receipts tax on movie houses should he find that it works a hardship on small town theatres. An attempt to ban the deduction of any federal excise taxes in computing income for state tax purposes was defeated in committee as was a counter proposal to permit their deduction. A bill to allow deduction of federal personal income tax is still in committee. The liquor business was the object of 2 proposals this week for raising revenue: HB 477 would increase the tax on liquor and wine 8.5 to 20% of retail price, yielding, according to its author, \$5 1-4 million a year. HB 440 would take 1/2 the net profits from local ABC stores for the state, yielding an estimated \$3 million a year for the general fund.

Roads and Streets
 With the fourth public hearing on the Powell city street bill set for Tuesday before the House appropriations committee, final action on this controversial measure earmarking highway funds for municipal streets without imposing new taxes cannot occur before Wednesday at the earliest. Despite stater opposition from the Highway Commission and the possibility of still more amendments, most observers feel the bill has passed its most strenuous test and will pass the House substantially in its Senate-approved form. Another controversial bill, this one reducing truck weight limits to pre-1949 levels, was scheduled for public hearing on Thursday but that hearing has been postponed until Tuesday. Meanwhile, engineers supervising the Maryland truck weight experiment announced that their findings are inconclusive and suggested that each state draw its own conclusions as to what the tests established. To assure compliance with whatever weight limits may be set, SB 273 was introduced to require the Highway Department to erect permanent weighing stations throughout the state and to take over from the Motor Vehicles Department the responsibility for enforcing truck weight limits. A Senate bill calling for the establishment of a commission to build toll roads has been reported favorably and set for debate next Thursday.

Matters of Interest to Local Officials
 This week the Senate approved HB 174, submitting to the people a constitutional amendment which would ease county financial struggles with the inelastic 1950 general fund property tax limitation by increasing the permissible levy to 20c, and killed a bill permitting counties to increase the dues paid the county commissioners association for the support of a full-time secretary. Meanwhile the agricultural committees scheduled a joint hearing Tuesday morning on bills relieving counties of the unwilling responsibility for taking an annual farm census. In the House HB 439, permitting cities and counties to increase employees' retirement benefits by adopting a plan involving 5% contribution by employees instead of 4%, received a favorable report. An effort was made to require JPs to post a \$1000 bond guaranteeing proper handling of public funds, and the bill, HB 111, passed, but in its final form applies to only 36 counties.

SPORTS AFIELD

 Two friends of mine drove 40 miles out of New York with a new idea for shooting crows.
 They wore homemade head nets of green mosquito netting. With their faces hooded by the netting and hands dabbed with mud they found that the crows came closer and stayed longer. But still there were times when the birds flared away unaccountably.
 They decided it was clothes. So a couple days later they bought surplus Marine Corps camouflage suits and head nets. What happened when they tried these getups was startling. They took a stand in fairly sparse cover, one with a gun and call and the other with a camera. The crows were over them in a minute. Seconds later the woods were a riot. Crows were flying among the tree trunks like rufed grouse.
 Later on they found that this sort of thing was by no means unusual, particularly when they stood so that there was plenty of sunlight and shadow on their camouflage suits.
 From this experience they naturally went on to further experiments. They learned that for camouflage to be most effective its wearer should stand before a backdrop of greenery at least as tall as he is and of the same approximate coloration as his suit. Further you've got to remain still until the crows get close enough for a good shot. The thing that appeals to me is that you don't have to fuss with a blind, or rig up an owl on a pole.
