## Toxaphene Not Recommended For Insect Control

Toxaphene not recommended for tobacco insect control says county agent Weeks. Results of experiments by Dr. Henry Townes, and a major tobacco company, indicate that a heavy application of toxaphene on tobacco shortly before harvest gave a distinct and disagreeable taste or aroma to cigarettes manufactured from it. It appears the off-odor will probably be present after lighter dosages. Because of the above findings, toxaphene is not recommended for tobacco insect control.
