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Duplin Sends \$2,250 To State Polio Fund

CHAPEL HILL - A check for \$2,250.00 to help provide care for local polio patients has been received by the Duplin County chapter of the national foundation for infantile paralysis. It was announced today by Mr. H. E. Phillips, chapter chairman.

When March of Dimes funds are raised, Mr. Phillips explained, half stays here with the local chapter and half goes to national headquarters for research, professional education and emergency aid to centers whose own funds have been exhausted by the demands of patient care. The check just received comes from this pooling of chapter funds at National headquarters. This makes a total of \$37,865.64 which Duplin County has received from the Epidemic Aid Fund at national headquarters since 1948. Mr. Phillips pointed out that the Duplin County chapter will be dependent upon the Epidemic Aid Fund to pay expenses of the chapter for the remainder of the year. Mr. Phillips said record-breaking polio incidence during the last three years had exhausted the treasuries of hundreds of chapters across the country and that in many cases 1951 March of Dimes funds had been committed to the payment of old bills before this year's first case had been reported.

Funds provided by this check will be used to help pay for hospitalization of one poliomyelitis patient from Duplin County. According to the records of the State Board of Health, no new polio cases have been reported in Duplin County this year.
