## Dodge Trucks Chosen Contest

J. S. Blair, President of Leading Motors Inc., Wallace Dodge Dealer, received word that 59 National Truck Roadie in Chicago chose Dodge "Job Rated" trucks to drive in the spirited contest for national titles.

Six of the nine national championships awarded in the straight truck, one tractor single-axle semi-trailer, and the tractor tandem-axle semi-trailer classes were won by contestants driving Dodge trucks.

All three places in the tractor single axle semi-trailer event were won by drivers who chose a Dodge JA-123 (2 1-2 ton) truck. Albert D.
