

HOW TO HANDLE green undergrowth in grain crops

Clover seeded with your grain crop builds up your soil, but this green undergrowth may be a problem at harvest time. Here is how to handle it.

A home-owned ALL-CROP Harvester lets you time your harvest perfectly. Catch the grain at full ripeness, but be-fore green undergrowth is too high.


