Nine Duplin Towns To Get Safety Award Nine towns in Duplin County are to receive an award this week and next from the State Department of Motor Vehicles in recognition of their outstanding traffic safety record in 1950. The announcement was made by W. L. Fountain, field representative of the Department's Highway Safety Division. The award itself is an attractive, yellow certificate which reads, "Presented by North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles Highway Safety Division to these towns in recognition of outstanding achievement in Highway Safety." The document is signed by Commissioner L. C. Rosser for the Department of Motor Vehicles and H. D. Jones, Engineer-Director of the Safety Division.
