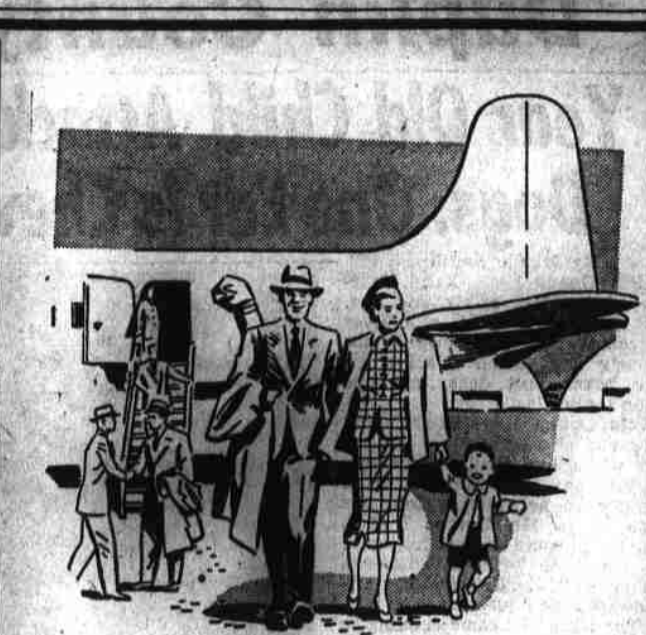
Milk production for the rest of the year probably will be below 1951. Demand will continue strong
