Manure should not be used for sweet potatoes and too much nitrogen wil make a poor quality potato. A ridge about 12 inches high is usually best and the plants should be set 12 inches apart in the row.

How to Do It-

Power Tools Deserve Good Care





Power tool cords can easily be protected. When a cord must be laid in the path of traffic lay two planks close together and run the cord between them. Avoid kinks and don't lay cords over sharpedged materials. Don't carry a tool by its cord.

In using an electric hand-saw, let the saw itself do the work. It's a mistake to try to rush a job, Don't press down on the top of the saw and don't crowd the saw by pushing it. A jammed saw overloads the motor, and motor repairs are expensive.
