It is the annual schooling races for the fifth meeting of the state's original dog track. From 15 to 20 races will be scheduled each night, except Sunday, from June 4 through June 10. Executive Secretary Paul Cleland announced today. All these canine youngsters must school.
These schooling races are free to the public, and children are allowed to attend these events prior to the official opening of the track on June 11.
Cleland explained: "All of these dogs have been running on other tracks, but due to the difference in certain elements, such as the turf, each dog must run three times on the Morehead City track so that the racing secretary, as well as the spectators, can get an accurate rating for future races."
