Asphalt Roll Roof

Nineteen - inch selvage, double coverage, asphalt roll roofing.

te's all parts of a roof with at

least two thicknesses of weather-tight material.

Like asphalt shingles, this type of roll roofing is surfaced with mineral granules. It is fire-resist-ant and is available in solid and blended solors.

A sheet of 19-inch selvage roof-ing is 36 inches wide. The mineral granules cover 17 inches of the width, leaving 19 inches unsur-faced. When the roofing is ap-plied the 19-inch unsurfaced por-tion is lapped completely by the next sheet put in place.

Roofs with a pitch as low as 1 inch of rise for each horizontal foot can be roofed with 19-inch selvage roofing. It is the only prepared asphalt poofing recommended for a fool pitch this low.


