

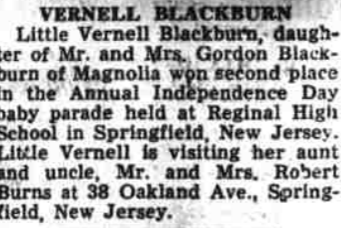

According to Acting County Ranger Leland H. Sheffield, from July 1, 1951 through June 30, 1952, 10,844 acres of forest land burned as a result of wild, uncontrolled forest fires. 91 forest fires burned during this period doing a damage of \$85,140.00 to the woodland of Duplin County.

On 28 of the 91 fires, the responsible parties were determined and law enforcement action was taken resulting in collection of court cost and fines and reimbursement of fire fighting cost.
