



QUESTION: At what stage should I cut grass for silage?
ANSWER: Grass for silage should be cut at an early stage of maturity. Legumes should be cut in the early bloom stage and grass

before bloom. Mixtures of grasses and legumes make the best silage. They should be cut at the stage best for the predominating kind of forage and wilted slightly. U. S. Department of Agriculture specialists point out.



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Wilted the crop slightly is beneficial. If it is cut early, but excessive wilting is harmful. Moisture content should be reduced below 70 per cent, but not below 60 per cent. Stalks and leaves should appear distinctly wilted and limp. The forage should feel cool and moist, but should show no free moisture when twisted, rubbed, or compressed in the hands. Usually two hours will be required in the middle of a hot day for wilting, but one hour may be sufficient if there is a good breeze. Additional time will be required if the crop is cut in the morning or late afternoon. Care should be taken to see that the crop is cut too far ahead of silo filling during good drying weather. Crops cut late in the day can be left overnight. Fresh unwilted crops should be used in the top layers of both trench and tower silos. Long crops or crops chopped long can be used in filling trench and stack silos. Crops stored in tower silos should be finely chopped.

ORDER AUTHORIZING \$82,000 REFUNDING BONDS

BE IT ORDERED AND RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Duplin: 1. That bonds of Duplin County, North Carolina, be issued, pursuant to The County Finance Act, as amended, in an amount not exceeding \$82,000 for the purpose of refunding a like amount of the principal of valid subsisting bonded indebtedness of said County which was originally incurred before January 1, 1929 for the construction of roads and bridges in said County and is evidenced by the following: \$10,000 Road and Bridge Bonds, dated March 1, 1922, maturing March 1, 1953. \$30,000 Road and Bridge Bonds, dated October 1, 1922, maturing October 1, 1952. \$10,000 Road and Bridge Bonds, dated April 1, 1927, maturing April 1, 1952. \$10,000 Road and Bridge Bonds, dated October 1, 1927, maturing October 1, 1952. \$8,000 Refunding Road and Bridge Bonds, dated August 1, 1937, maturing February 1, 1963. 2. That bonds of Duplin County, North Carolina, be issued, pursuant to The County Finance Act, as amended, in an amount not exceeding \$14,000 for the purpose of refunding a like amount of the

principal of valid subsisting bonded indebtedness of said County which was originally incurred by the Board of Commissioners (as an administrative agent of the State in providing a State system of public schools) for maintaining the constitutional six months' school term and is evidenced by the following: \$8,000 School Bonds, dated April 1, 1923, maturing April 1, 1953. \$5,000 School Funding Bonds, dated September 1, 1931, maturing September 1, 1952. \$2,000 Refunding School Bonds, dated August 1, 1937, maturing February 1, 1953. \$2,000 School Building Bonds, dated June 1, 1946, maturing June 1, 1953. 3. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the \$82,000 bonds herein authorized, when due, shall be annually levied and collected. 4. That the holders of the \$82,000 bonds herein authorized shall be subrogated to all the rights and powers of the holders of the indebtedness refunded thereby. 5. That a statement of the County debt has been filed with the clerk and is open to public inspection. 6. That this order shall take effect upon its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters. The foregoing order was finally passed on the 21st day of July, 1952, and was first published on the 24th day of July, 1952.
