Eastern Carolina Is Brush Invaded

Morehead City — By cracky, the place may never be the same! Not only Morehead City and its beautiful dog track, but the whole of Eastern Carolina is going to be invaded this week end.

They're not men from Mars, they're not 30-inch flying saucer pilots—they're the Brothers of the Brush from Thomasville!

Come Friday afternoon up around Thomasville, where they're planning big centennial things September 14-20, two busloads and a motorcade of Brothers of the Brush will embark for parts East. They're bound for Morehead City and a big Saturday night at the dog track where Brothers Of The Brush Handicap will be held as the feature race.

What route they'll take through Eastern Carolina has not been disclosed, but Harold Harrelson, the bushy head man of the Brothers in Thomasville, wired this communique today: "We're leaving Thomasville Friday afternoon. We will hold mock trial at several towns en route, but we can't wait

'Horn In The West'

Boone, N. C. — Nightly attendance at "Horn in the West" is still gaining as the Kermit Hunter outdoor drama approaches the final two weeks of its first summer season at the Daniel Boone Amphitheatre in Boone. Performances are being given nightly except Mondays through August 31.

During its first six weeks the drama, which opened June 27, was seen by more than 26,000 people, reports Mason Bliss, business manager. Bliss says that advance reservations for performances between now and August 31 indicate that the total ticket count will go over the 50,000 mark.

Although North Carolinians make up the majority of a typical "Horn in the West" audience, tourists from 45 states have come to see the drama, and the percentage of out-of-state cars on the parking lots is increasing as the tourist season of Northwestern North Carolina nears its August peak.

Groups from clubs, schools, churches and industries are often in the theatre. Many groups bring picnic suppers to eat on the theatre grounds before showtime. Most of the groups make the trip to Boone by chartered bus and return home after the show, but several Boy Scout troops have camped overnight at the theatre grounds. Prominent on the parking lot four nights a week is Greyhound's big "Horn in the West" special, which operates between Winston-Salem and the drama on a regular schedule.

The increase of visitors to the Boone-Blowing Rock area since "the Horn" opened has resulted in a brisk demand for food and lodging, but tourists find the citizens of the area as friendly and accommodating as ever. At the theatre box office and the downtown information office in Boone visitors may make room reservations when they buy their tickets to the drama. Rooms may also be reserved when tickets are ordered by mail or telephone.
