Last week we discussed briefly the subject of permanent and winter lawns. Because there are situations where it is not practicable to grow grass or build a lawn it is timely to say something about ground covers.

A ground cover is some low growing plant or vine which will cover areas where grass will not grow—such as heavily shaded spots, steep banks, or stony areas. There are a number of plants that may be used as ground covers, namely: English ivy, vine (periwinkle), Pachysandra (Japanese Spurge), a Juno (Bugle weed), and Ophiopogon japonicus (lily turf). All of these are evergreen and most of them are hardy throughout the state except possibly Ophiopogon which is hardly east of the mountains.

Of the above named plants English ivy and periwinkle are well known to most gardeners and we will not discuss them. They are vine plants and are commonly used to cover steep banks. Pachysandra (Japanese Spurge) is an upright evergreen plant growing about 4 to 6 inches in height and spreading by means of underground root stocks. It thrives in shade and is well adapted to our cooler areas. Ajuga (Bugle weed) is probably the least desirable of the ground covers. It belongs to the mint family, spreads by means of underground root stocks and sends up flower stalks in the spring. Ophiopogon (lily turf) has been

very popular in the eastern half of the state. It grows about 4 inches high and the leaves are dark green and resemble grass leaves. It will thrive in deep shade and in stony ground where real grass will not grow. It spreads by means of underground root stocks. In order to obtain a good stand the plants should be set about a foot apart in each direction. Ophiopogon should not be cut with a lawn mower but many need occasional thinning out.
