Welfare Department Notes

My Mrs. Theodos D. Taylor

The need for boarding homes for children is increasing in Duplin County and in the State, said Mrs. Taylor, Superintendent of the county Department of Public Welfare, in discussing these facilities.

The State-wide program which assists in providing boarding homes for children is one of the most valuable programs administered by welfare agencies, she said. "I believe more homes would be offered for this purpose if the people knew the need for such homes and the plan which provides for them."

Boarding homes are licensed to care for children who are in one of two groups. One group is made up of children who are neglected or deserted and taken care of while parents are made for permanent living arrangements. Children with behavior problems are provided good homes under this plan so that they can become better adjusted. Children with special physical or mental handicaps are given the individualized attention needed. All of these and more add up to a tremendous saving in child life and happiness in the course of a year. Care is taken to place a child in a home suited to his special needs.

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The County Department of Public Welfare shares responsibility for the child with the foster parent and a staff member makes regular visits to the home.

The State boarding home fund is made up of contributions of 50 per cent matching basis for individual children. Applications for this aid are made on the basis of the need of the individual child and on the condition of placement in a licensed boarding home. Children because the majority of the children cared for through these boarding homes have no relatives who can maintain homes for their care.

In Duplin County we have one licensed boarding home for white children which stays filled to its capacity. The one licensed boarding home for Negro children does not have any boarders at present.

For the year ending June 30, 1952, a total of 404 children in 71 counties were taken care of in 1500 Mrs. Alda Konegay gave a Stanley demonstration. Prior to adjournment, Mrs. V. H. Reynolds, treasurer was honored with a stork shower.
