

# SPORTS AFIELD

What makes a boat tip? That's a question sportsmen should know more about. Since most boats are bought without being tried first, knowledge of just what features affect stability becomes important. Certainly it is to the man who plans to build or assemble his own small boat, or who rents a boat.

Here then are the factors affecting tipiness or stability in a small boat, as outlined by boating expert Willard Crandall:

1. Width. By far the most important factor. Just a few inches can make a difference even a 300 pound fisherman would notice.

2. Bottom Style. Flat bottoms give the least tip, round bottoms the most, largely because the flats have more effective beam — more width well in the water. The more a round or V bottom tends toward flatness, the more stable it's apt to be.

3. Flare to Sides. Tip may start just as easily in a boat with sides that lean outward markedly, but it will stop a lot quicker.

4. Height of Seats. The higher up any weight aboard is, the more tipy the boat becomes. Center of gravity should be kept low — that's the way it's usually stated. Low seats do make a difference, especially with narrow boats.

5. Length. This is less important than width, but does play a part. The longer the boat the more there is to be shoved against the water when any tipping starts.

6. Keel. One with some depth or weight to it, or both, will help steady the boat.

7. Height of sides. Last, and least important factor. But high sides do add to tipiness a little.

As long as we're on the subject of boats, I'd like to comment on boat handles. If your wood outboard is heavy and doesn't have lifting handles, don't hesitate to put some on. You'll need three; two are placed on the back of the transom, one on each side and the other is put on the front deck right at the point of the bow. It's best to bolt rather than screw these handles on. They sell for around \$2 a marine supply store.

## Warsaw Tigers Upset Jacksonville In Conf. Win

In a very hard fought game the Warsaw Tigers managed to hold the Jacksonville Cardinals scoreless during a hectic 4th quarter after scoring the winning touchdown in the 3rd quarter. Jacksonville made 3 threats to score their 3rd touchdown after Warsaw had taken the kickoff at the half time and marched to their winning score with Milton Smith completing his only pass of the night for 18 yards and the T.D. Smith then kicked the invaluable extra point to beat Jacksonville by 13 to 12 and the Warsaw fans went wild with joy.

Mike Glover for Jacksonville once again as he has done all season put on a fine running exhibition as he gained 117 yds. with a loss of only 12 yards for a net gain of 105 yards as well as scoring both of Jacksonville's touchdowns but Glover's work was to no avail as Warsaw was not to be denied the victory.

Gerald Daugherty for Jacksonville also did some fine running as he gained 51 yards in 8 tries without a loss and made the longest running play for Jacksonville which was for 33 yards. Gerald Jones was the leading ground gainer for Warsaw as he gained 98 yards without a loss in 8 tries and Jones made the longest run of the game which was for 51 yards.

Milton Smith gained 49 yards and lost 17 yards but made 3 of Warsaw's 7 first downs. Gene Thompson gained 30 yards and lost 1 in 5 tries for the Tigers. Hughie Lewis, Warsaw's hard running full back could only gain 28 yards without a loss in 8 tries as the Jacksonville defense seemed to be set for him after hearing of his great running exhibition against Wallace on October 17th as he gained 154 yards in 23 tries without a loss for a 6.7 average per try. J. D. Davis for the Tigers did a fine job on defense as he blocked a Jacksonville punt and then made many hard tackles for Warsaw and recovered two Cardinals fumbles. Gene Thompson recovered a fumble after a long pass had been completed to stop the last Jacksonville drive deep in Warsaw territory.
