

Duplin Forest Ranger Sheffield Promoted To District Ranger

Mr. L. P. Wells, Chairman Board of County Commissioners R.F.D. Mount Olive, N. C. Dear Mr. Wells:

After the resignation of Ralph Miller as County Forest Ranger on May 13, 1952, I wrote to you and the other County Commissioners requesting that you submit to this

office a list of prospective replacements to fill this position, any of which would be agreeable with the Board of County Commissioners. From the list submitted to us, we selected L. H. Sheffield, who was employed by the Department of Fire Control Equipment Operator. Sheffield has only served a few months as County Forest Ranger of Duplin County during

which time his work has been very satisfactory. On June 18, District Ranger D. L. McQueen resigned, which resulted in another vacancy in our organization. We have considered all personnel in our department who qualify to take the place of Mr. McQueen and have decided that Sheffield should be promoted to District Ranger with headquarters in Whiteville; there-

fore, I am asking that you submit to me at your earliest convenience names of 4 or 5 prospective applicants to take the place of Sheffield as County Forest Ranger in Duplin County. Qualifications are as follows. The applicant must have a high school education, be over 21 years of age and under 45, must have 5 years experience in farm or rural work

and preferably related to forest protection, must have good health and be married, and must have a telephone and live as nearly as possible in the center of Duplin County. Thank you very much for your cooperation. Yours very truly, Joe Herlevich District Forester

Survey Shows Free Trees Being Given To 4-Hers And FFA Are Not Being Wasted

Those free trees being given for the asking to 4-Hers, Future Farmers, and adult farmers aren't being wasted, according to John L. Gray, State College extension forester.

Last summer, extension forestry personnel selected at random and visited 10 per cent of those people who had received free tree seedlings paid for by the Champion Paper and Fibre Company, the N. C. Pulp Company, and the International Paper Company.

The survey revealed that 97 per cent of the white pine and short-leaf pine seedlings furnished to 4-Hers were planted and 85 per cent were living.

Champion is again offering 350,000 white pine and 150,000 short-leaf pine seedlings for distribution through county agents to youngsters in the western Piedmont. This is twice the number the company furnished to 4-Hers last year, of which 95 per cent were planted and 74 per cent living. The pulp company is making available a like number this year.

International Paper Company donated 520,000 trees to adult farmers in 39 counties last year. The survey showed that 97 per cent of these trees were planted and 80 per cent were alive. International has 500,000 trees available for free distribution to adult landowners this year.

Interested 4-Hers, Future Farmers and adults should contact their local county agents for order blanks and details on obtaining these seedlings.

Plant in McKeesport, Pennsylvania, where an average output of 81.6 net tons of steel was produced per operating furnace hour during October.

Record production was achieved also by many of U. S. Steel's blast furnaces, rolling mills, and shipping departments in all of its steel producing centers.
