Notice to Registrants Coming Up For Induction

Seniors in high school who are satisfactorily pursuing a course of instruction that will permit their graduation at the end of this academic year will be granted a postponement of induction until after their graduation if they make a written request for postponement and furnish a statement from the principal of the school stating their class standing.

College students will be postponed until the end of the present academic year provided they make a written request for postponement and have on file information specifically stating that they are presently enrolled and satisfactorily pursuing a full-time course of study.
