and bottled foods, measuring cups, spoons, etc. in the wall unit. Base cabinets provide storage for bulk quantities of sugar and flour mix ing utensils such as bowls, flour sifters, rolling pin, cutlery, baking pans and casseroles. Divided space is needed.

Our management specialists say determine whether an item should, be stored in a wall cabinet or base cabinet. Organize articles in the cabinets so that those stored in back though infrequently used, can be reached easily when needed. Use accessories such as stepup shelves, cup rack, drawer dividers and bulk storage bins to assure neat and easy to find storage.

Sink cabinet should provide space for holding cleaning supplies brushes, towels.

Cooking Center: Deep drawers in the range will hold skillets, lids and saucepans. Storage next to the range is the spot for cooking and serving utensils—ladles, wooden spoons, spatulas, etc. This area too is a good spot for toaster, waffile iron and trays.

Adequate storage space in the kitchen saves many extra steps from one spot to the other. Well organized equipment makes for efficient work. Plan your storage the way that will help you most.

Question: I have a half-share agreement with my landlord and recently I've been trying to get him to buy a tractor but he seems to think that the tenant should furnish power. Who's right?

Answer: C. B. Ratchford in charge of farm management and marketing for the State College Extension Service agrees with the landlord and he says that half-share tenant agreements where the landlord furnishes power and equipment are hindering mechanization in North Carolina.

The landlord who has an agreement calling for him to furnish equipment does not get any benefits from reduced labor requirements when he adds a tractor; pay ment for labor is included in the half share of cropper.

Thus says Ratchford when a tractor and complementary equipment are added the investment and powers costs of the landlord may be increased while his labor cost is not reduced.

Tractors and equipment are primarily a substitute for labor. The party furnishing labor should also furnish equipment so that the substitution of capital for labor may take place Ratchford points out.

He asserts that there are other reasons why the tenant should own equipment: It is not advisable to let one person use expensive equipment belonging to another person. Also an arrangement in which the

Thousands of farm or randh workers and their families now have social security insurance protection, according N. A. Avera, manager of the Wilmington, N. C. office of the Social Security Administration.

Agricultural labor has been covered by social security since Jan-uarry, 1, 1951, when the worgker is regularly employed Avera explain ed. The farm or ranch worker who has put in the past two years in regular agricultural work has in-surance protection for two more years for his family in case of his

for two more years. Avera urges regular agricultural workers to make sure their em-ployers are properly reporting

their wages on social security re-turns are properly made. These returns must be made every three inontes and sent to the Director of Internal Revenue. They must show the worker's correct name, social security number, and wages.
