Pink Hill and Deep Run took top honors in two Southwood Federation of Future Farmers of America contests staged Tuesday at Southwood School. Both school chapters took a first and second place.

Roger Post Hill of Pink Hill was picked as winner of the public speaking event, beating out three other contestants. Jimmy Grady of Deep Run was second, Benjamin Gray of Jones County was third and Charlie Miller of Pamlico County was fourth. Hill spoke on "Future Farmers—Why Are We Here?" and explained the opportunities for boys in FFA work. He will represent the federation in the district event in May.
