## Farmers Gunning For Prize Money

Nearly 600 Carolina farmers have enlisted in "helping to build a Finer Carolina" by building finer farms according to reports reaching the Power & Light Company, sponsor of the contest.

Only 17 of the 60 eligible counties have reported, but these indicate that 683 farmers have entered 178 acres of land in the contest which offers \$2,800 in prizes for soil and water conservation projects.

Enthusiastic responses also from the other eligible counties are predicted by E. N. Pope, CP advertising manager and director of the "Finer Carolina" contest which 108 towns are competing for \$6,750 of additional prize money offered for community development.

Competing farms range in size all the way from S. A. Fagg's 23 acres in Randolph County to 18,000-acre plantation of T. C. C. Jr., in Darlington County. In that South Carolina county all counties which have reported thus far in total acreage enter its total being 61723. Montague County leads in the number of individual farmers reported in contest, its total being 123.
