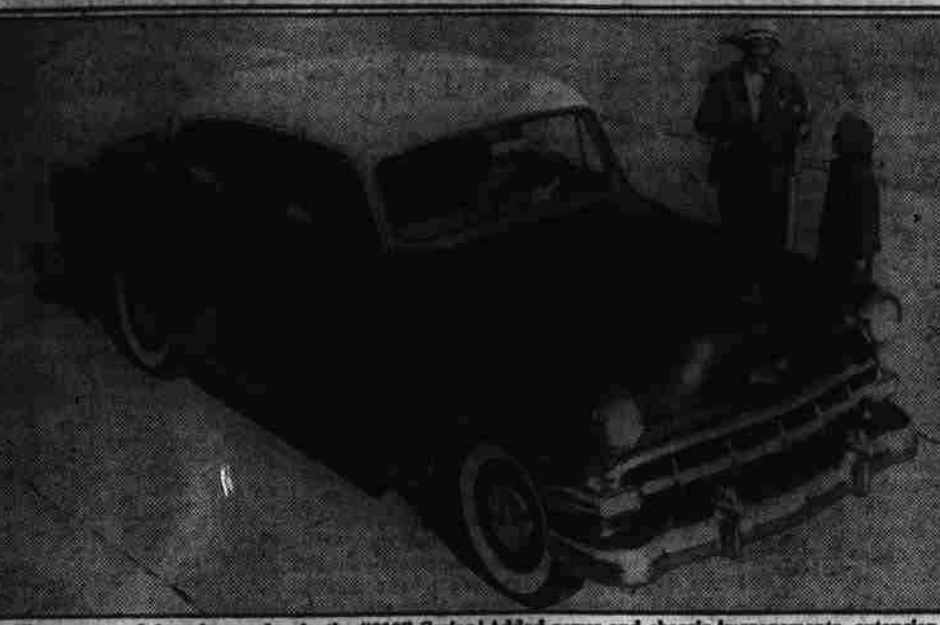

and export, started last April, are designed to strengthen the nation's cattle market, according to our county agent.

He says recent reports show that the U. S. Department of Agriculture will have purchased between 220 and 225 million pounds of beef by the year's end. This is the equivalent of more than 750,000 head of cattle, according to the county agent.

Sharp drops in cattle prices, which started their downward trend two years ago, are largely the result of increased marketings from a record national cattle herd of 94 million head. Drought has complicated the situation by stepping up marketings, particularly of lower-grade cattle, and reducing the normal demand for animals for high-finished feeding and herd replacements.

The bulk of the government's beef purchases are being distributed through the school lunch program and nonprofit institutions. About 18 million pounds were purchased by the Foreign Operations Administration for overseas distribution.

Because producer price problems are greatest this year in the cheaper grades of cattle, owing to prolonged drought conditions, the government contracts have called for commercial and utility grade carcasses, with greatest emphasis on cutter and canner grades.

will think he has licked the disease, when actually he has only arrested it. "Birds making a recovery as far as external symptoms are concerned, may later become carriers of the infection. These carriers eliminate the tiny typhoid germs through the droppings and through discharge from the mount. This tends to perpetuate the disease on the premises."

When typhoid strikes your poultry flock there isn't much you can do but kill the carriers and sell the remaining birds for meat, according to R. S. Dearstyne, head of the Department of Poultry Science at N. C. State College.

Dearstyne says typhoid is one of the most destructive of all poultry diseases and that mortality usually runs "very high" in flocks that have suffered attacks.

Many different types of medication are suggested as treatment, but Dearstyne says results are not always good. Often the flock owner

Unique Foods Add Spark To Holiday Festivities
Begin thinking now in terms of what you can serve when friends and relatives drop in from time to time during the holiday season.
There is always a good reason for buying the best. The quality of the ingredients and the skill of the cook are the keys to a successful holiday meal.

Juice, a recipe taken from the files of Ruth Currier, State home demonstration agent:
HOT SPICED GRAPE JUICE
Juice of 1 lemon
1 quart of grape juice (canned or frozen)
2 cups boiling water
1/4 cup sugar
2 nutmegs (crushed)
1/2 stick cinnamon
4 slices orange rind.
Cut the orange rind in small pieces (use from white inner skin).
Put all ingredients in a large saucepan and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 10 minutes. Strain through a fine sieve and serve hot.
