

Wilmington Band To Be At Rose Hill
Rose Hill Music Club And Theatre
 To Present New Hanover Junior Band

The New Hanover Junior High Band, under the direction of Richard Dobson will appear in Concert here March 22.

This concert will offer the community the opportunity of hearing a most outstanding band. From a humble beginning a few years ago, with few instruments and homemade uniforms, this musical organization of Wilmington, N. C. has moved to the forefront among band groups of the state.

With the aid of a fine Parents Club, the young musicians and Mr. Dobson have overcome many of their difficulties and for the last two happy years have possessed a "Superior" rating from the State Music Festival Contest held each Spring in Greensboro, N. C.

They appear for all concerts and parades proudly dressed in handsome red and white uniforms, and using fine new instruments. They have been called one of the best dressed bands in the State.

Last Fall they made a trip to play at the halftime of the Carolina-Maryland football game at Chapel Hill. There they played before 35,000 people, with the University of North Carolina Band, the Maryland Band, and 27 high school bands. This was the only Junior High Band participating in the event. The band is growing each year and now consists of 70 boys and girls.

The band is acclaimed by crowds whenever it appears. Last Spring they were invited to play for the second consecutive year for the State Federation of Music Clubs at their Annual Meeting in Charlotte. At that meeting Mrs. Ada Holding Miller of Providence, R. I. and president of the National Federation of Music Clubs, characterized the band as being "The best high band that she had heard anywhere in the United States."

The N. C. State Federation president, Mrs. Laura Howell Norden, in an article on the band, said, "The performance of the band was marked by a fine musicianship and showed a remarkable maturity. The performance was something to remember and dream on. The performance throughout was smooth and flexible and showed considerable technical skill. Mr. Dobson is an exciting conductor and his musicians are well trained to follow whatever effect he indicates."

In another article written by Mrs. Norden following the band's fine Christmas Concert last December, she said, "The Junior High Band is a full symphonic organization and is a far-cry from the small groups of enthusiastic tooters trained by Mr. Dobson a few years ago. This band has complete sections of woodwind, reeds, and brasses. It plays with a smooth tone, in decisive attack and good phrasing."

Mr. Dobson has won for himself the name of a great Junior High School conductor with his years of untiring work with this group. He is proud of his band, and the people of the Wilmington area are proud to send them out in the State for others to enjoy. Mr. Dobson is a native of Duplin County.

Each year they march and play in Wilmington's Christmas and Azalea Parades. Last Spring they played for the N. C. State P.T.A. Convention in Wilmington before the entire assemblage in Thalian Hall, the State Lion's Convention at Wrightsville Beach, and the Shriners' Convention. They average twenty five appearances a year including an annual Christmas and Spring Concert in Wilmington, the Easter Sunrise Service at Greenfield Lake, and a night concert at the World's Largest Living Christmas Tree in Wilmington. This popular band is in great demand for many types of appearances. Last Summer five of its members were awarded scholarships to attend the Transylvania Music Camp at Brevard, N. C. by various music and civic groups.

Dennis Ramsey, owner of the Rose Hill Theater is co-operating with the Rose Hill Music Club in making it possible to present the band in Rose Hill. It will appear at the theater in an evening performance. Tickets will be offered for sale next week.
