Filmed highlights of Joe Louis' knockout victory over Tony Galento will be shown on NBC-TV's "Greatest of the Century" Friday, March 19 (10:45 p.m., EST, or immediately following live fights telecast from Madison Square Garden). For months Two-Ton Tony had boasted he would "molder the guy." Louis gave him the opportunity in the Polo Grounds on June 28, 1939. In the third round, one of Tony's wild swings dropped Joe for a second or two. Nettled, the Brown Bomber poured it on in the fourth, reducing Tony to a helpless hulk.

First one comes during the Azalea Street Dance which will be staged on Market Street Front and Second Streets in downtown Wilmington at 9 p.m. Thursday, March 25. Next will be the Folk Music Ambroses at Legion Stadium at 2:30 p.m. Saturday, March 27. And at 9:15 p.m. on the same day will be the "Saturday Night Country Style" show at New Hanover High School. This will be broadcast in the Auditorium on a nationwide CBS Network program.

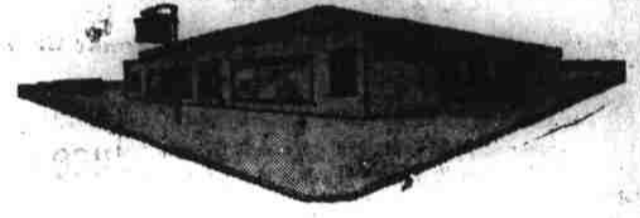
