

Plantation Pecan Trees

Each tree should receive two pounds of 8-4-8, or 5-10-10 for each year of its age up to 40 to 50 pounds per tree.

For trees in the ground, small holes about one foot deep and two feet apart and place the fertilizer in the holes, Goforth explained. These holes should be made at different distances from the tree, placing some close to the tree and others as far out as the branches extend.

Pecans are generally considered to be alternate bearers, producing heavy crops every other year. To produce normal crops every year the trees must have sufficient plant food to mature the present year's crop of nuts at the same time build up enough reserve in the tree to develop next year's fruit buds, said Goforth.

Pecan trees are very exact in their lime needs, Goforth said. The trees need just enough but not too much. In building a house or plastering a house, lime piled too close to the trees will cause the soil to be too sweet. If trees are not bearing satisfactorily it would pay to take a soil sample. This condition can be corrected by following the soil test report.

Excise Tax Cuts Means Savings To Telephone Users

Tax on your telephone service, which has ranged from 15 to 25 per cent, since it originated during 1941, was reduced to a straight 10 per cent effective April 1, following President Eisenhower's signing of the general excise bill.

Despite the fact that the tax was levied on the necessity in modern living, it was until Thursday, the highest excise tax the government levied, with the exception of that on liquor and tobacco.

Beach 1964 Peak

Taxes of your telephone service reached their peak in 1944 when the Congress levied what it termed "war tax rates." These higher rates were imposed at the time to help raise revenue, and to discourage the use of telephone at a time when the government needed these facilities for war communications, and when new service could not be installed or expanded because of the lack of materials and manpower.

The law provided that these taxes should expire six months after the close of hostilities.

Reductions or eliminations of this tax will not put one more penny into the treasury of the Carolina Telephone and Telegraph Company. All the telephone company has been doing for these past years was to act as a tax collector for Uncle Sam, an official said.

The money collected from telephone subscribers has been sent to Washington about as fast as it was collected. The only people that will be helped by the repeal of this law are the people who use the telephone, the official added.
