Nursery Department Warsaw Baptist Church Moved Into New Home Sunday

The Nursery Department of the Warsaw Baptist Church moved into its new church home Sunday morning, April 25 at 9:45 a.m. Making the transfer from one tiny, unequipped room to the spacious new quarters were 45 children and 12 department leaders. Mrs. Henry Askew is superintendent and Mrs. Alton Greenlaw, assistant. Nursery 1-A has Mrs. Nathan Costin and Mrs. George Clark in charge of the "Sleepers" Nursery 1-B (toddlers and "Creeper") is led by Mrs. H. C. Allen and Mrs. Elwood Revelle; The "Weepers" Nursery II, are directed by Mrs. Elbert Mathis, and Mrs. Kenneth Brock. Nursery III-A (The "Leapers") are their teachers Mrs. Bonnie Thomas and Mrs. Fred Revelle. Nursery III-B (The "Reapers") are taught by Mrs. Ed Pollinski and Mrs. McDonald Brock. The total enrollment of the five units of this department is 62, not including any of many prospects.

In order that a child may progress year by year from infancy through entrance to public school with the same group, the Nursery department groups are divided according to the date the child will start to school: those born after Oct. 15 (too late to enter school) and those born the next month and can go to school when six form a group. Every child in every grouping will be promoted each year, thereby eliminating having any "left-behinds" in the Beginner Department. In the new education plant, 7 separate rooms, counting the Sleepers' bed room, have been provided for the pre-school ages.

The Beginners, 58 enrolled, will be transferred to the new building within a few weeks. These two groupings are taught by Mrs. Forest Martin, Mrs. Milford Quinn, Mrs. George Hopkins, Mrs. Charlie Gore and Mrs. Dickie Herring.
