Charlie Herring, veteran tobacco-nist of Kinston and a native of Duplin County visited us a few days ago. He said the tobacco crop in Georgia was looking fine at this date and he is looking for a good year for all tobacco farmers. Mr. Herring operates the Star warehouse, Kinston's largest single house, two houses in Macon, Ga. the past year and one house in Abbington, Va. He told us he had recently purchased a third house in Meadow, Ga. which is now under construction and will be completed when the markets open there. The new house will contain approximately 100,000 square feet of floor space. He is now the sole owner of four warehouses and operates one under a lease, probably the only tobacco warehouseman in this state with

that record. In all of his houses he has a total of approximately 400,000 feet of

floor space. Mr. Herring says that when the North Carolina friends who want markets open in Georgia he will be able to take care of more of his to sell down there.

CARE OF YOUR WASHER PAYS OFF

Regardless of what laundry product you use, regular care of the washer by the housewife will greatly increase its length of satisfactory service. Care can also eliminate many service calls. Always follow the manufacturer's directions. If the directions booklet gets lost, write to the manufacturer for another. Take care of the washer after using as well as during use. The more care it has while in use, the less repair it will need. Rinse, drain and dry after each use. Flush out the washing machine thoroughly with plain water and don't forget to rinse the cover of the washer, too, drying the underneath part with a cloth. CAUSES OF "YELLOWING" — Yellowing, like graying, is often caused when soap is used and is not completely rinsed out. Heat of ironing will often turn fabrics yellow. Clothes can yellow during storage. This can be due to improper washing, soap or starch left in the material, improper rinsing and

the like. If yellowing due to redeposited soil or deterioration of the fabric, the sun will not help to make the except for calendar adjustments garment white again.

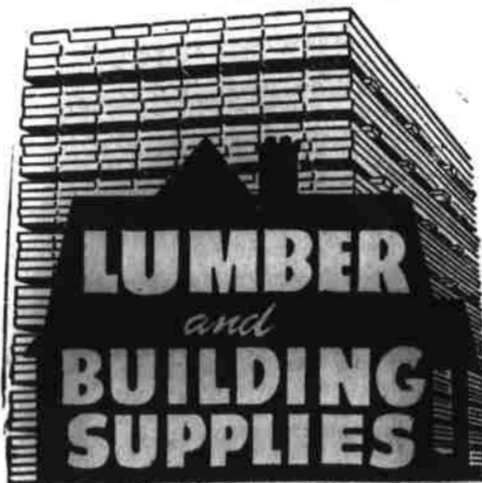

Bible Comment:

Godliness Must Be a Way of Daily Life

WHEN we speak of a man as being "a godly man," what do we mean? We are sure that he is essentially a reverent man, with a true sense of holiness. He is probably a good churchman, who manifests good moral living.

But is that all there is to godliness? We know from very high authority that it is not. We have the story of the rich young man, who came to Jesus, inquiring how he might inherit eternal life. He was probably more correct in his way of life than even most men of conventional goodness.

Yet he lacked the one most essential thing. "Where your treasure is," said Jesus, "there will your heart be also."

The young man's supreme attachment was to his great possessions, which in his ultimate decision he chose rather than companionship with Jesus, and the possibility of becoming the twelfth Apostle, when Judas Iscariot failed.

But godliness consists in what comes after acceptance of God as the treasure of the heart. When one reads with insight the account of the early Christian church, in the New Testament, and especially in the Epistles, an apparent and surprising discovery is that so many accepted God and the Christian way, without any clear comprehension of all that it meant.

For those of that early Christian time, and for countless, professing Christians of today, the beloved Apostle leaves no doubt about godliness in daily life. His plain, strong words are: "If a man love not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen? If a man say, 'I love God,' and hateth his brother, he is a liar; for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen?"
