Douglas H.S.N.F.A. Receives Modern Farmers Degree

Nathan Bell of the Warsaw chapter of The New Farmers of America gained state recognition for the local chapter during the 26th annual Convention of the North Carolina Association of New Farmers of America, in the competitive livestock judging contest, which was held June 6th to 8th, at A. and T. College, Greensboro, N. C.

As a result of the splendid livestock judging performed by Bell during the month of April for the local chapter and the Berry O'Kelly Federation at State College, Raleigh, N. C. he was chosen on the basis of having received the highest score for judging than any of the other 32 participants to represent the Federation on the State level during the State Convention along with the next two highest scoring boys, who were from Shawton High School, Lillington, N. C. and Shepherd High School of Zebulon, N. C. Although the team did not gain top honors at the State level, Bell was successful in gaining for himself as an individual judge the fourth place on the State team; The position of an alternate judge which will travel to Atlanta, Ga. during the month of September to take part in the National Livestock Judging Contest.

Received Modern Farmer Degree

For his outstanding accomplishments in the way of Vocational Agriculture and Supervised Farming Program, Bell received the Modern Farmer Degree. Bell who will be a Senior in Vocational Agriculture this fall, completed in the way of a Supervised Farming Program for the year of 1953, 1 acre of tobacco, 2 acres of corn, 1 brood sow, 7 feeder pigs of which reached market weight in 7 months. For his Home Improvement Program, Bell constructed screen doors and windows and also a unit of kitchen cabinets; He also assisted his father in painting the Farm Dwelling. As a senior, Bell's Supervised Farming Program will consist of 2 brood sows, 18 feeder hogs, 1 acre of tobacco, 5 acres of corn, 1 beef heifer; 1 1/2 acres of permanent and temporary pasture, with plans calling for, upon completion of High School, to enter into the business of Farming with emphasis upon Swine and Beef Cattle production.
