Four Problems Are Facing Dairy Industry

Four major problems currently face the dairy industry, according to agricultural economists at Washington.

First they list the production cost problem. There is little relief in sight for the cost-price squeeze in which dairymen are presently caught. Economists say all dairymen should try to find ways to reduce production costs.

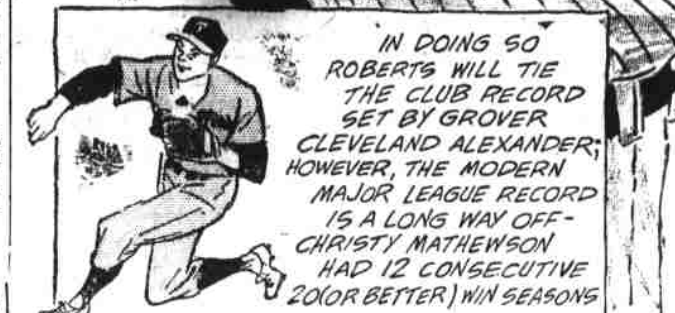
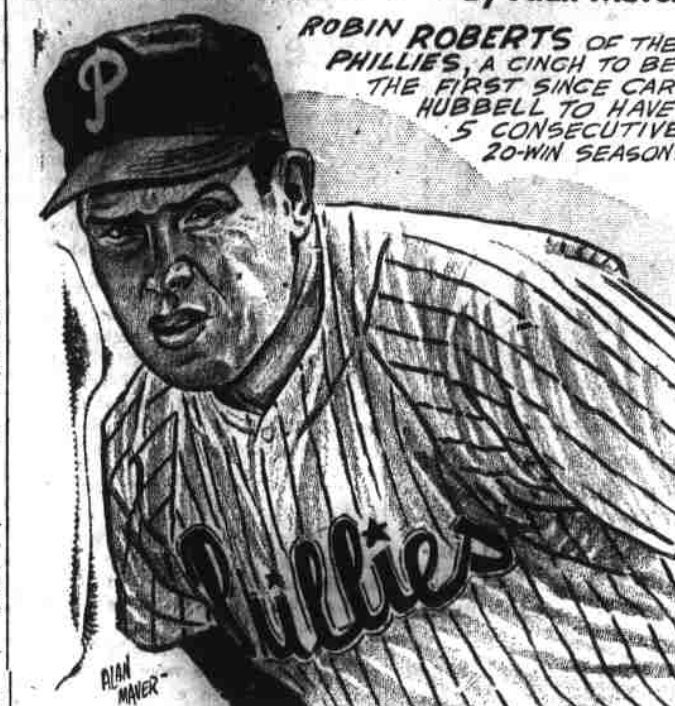
The butterfat problem is all too familiar to the dairymen. The decline in the relative demand for milkfat is due to several factors. The increased competition of vegetable fats with butter has been hard to meet.

Added to this is the growing competition of vegetable fats with butter fat in frozen desserts, etc. Somehow, the economists say, butterfat must be made to compete effectively with the other fats.

Another problem is that of diverted acres. Farmers were asked this year to divert some 20,000,000 acres of land previously in wheat, cotton, and corn. A big question is, how many of these acres will become the base for additional dairy production?

The fourth problem deals with marketing costs. Many dairymen, and consumers as well, feel that costs of processing and marketing

Negro Home Agent Gives Timely Tips On Buying Fabrics

School days are here again and Frances Corbett, Negro Home Agent would like to pass on to the women of Duplin County some timely tips on Buymanship of Fabrics; ready made garments and sweaters.

These timely tips were sent to the agent's office by Genevieve M. Kyer, Negro Subject Matter Specialist. Home sewing will help greatly to cut your family clothing dollar. The best values may be found in selecting washable fabrics, because they will be easier and less expensive to care for. The only way you will be able to know whether the fabrics you select is washable will be to read the labels. If you select one of the newer fabrics, be sure to read the label to see what finish has been given the fabric such as: whether it is wrinkle resistant, water repellent, fire repellent, sanforized, moth resistant, colorfast, permanent crispness, or whether it has been treated for shrinkage control. Also read the label to find out if the fabric should be washed, or dry cleaned; and do which ever is recommended by the manufacturer.

Never buy a ready made garment unless you try it on. Fit it over your regular foundation garments. Stand, sit, bend, reach and stretch in it. If it requires too many alterations, do not buy that garment, shop for another garment, or go to another store. Look for good workmanship, such as: accurate cut on the grain of cloth, generous pleats, well-made buttonholes, wide seams and hem. Examine the garments for good buttons, trimmings, belts, stitching done with matching thread, and matching lining if there is a lining or interlining. Regardless of how little or how much you have to spend for a

sweater, you can buy good ones if you learn how to judge the quality of sweaters that are in the stores today. Read the attached label to be sure it is flameproof. Examine the workmanship of the sweater, especially the way parts are shaped and joined, also the finishes at the neck and front openings. Stretch the banding on the bottom of the sleeves and waist. Good banding will stretch and spring back in shape quickly. The edges of the ribbed bandings on sweaters are sometimes reinforced with extra yarn which helps to add strength. Sweaters are full-fashioned at the armholes, sleeves, and sides (these seams resemble the seams found in full fashioned stockings.) Knitted ribs in the sweater, ribs on the front of the sweater where buttons and buttonholes are located should run straight. Examine the seams on the wrong side, they should resemble machine
