Medical Society To Award \$600 Scholarship For Essay

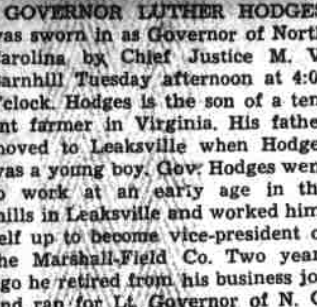
