During courtship the male canvas back throws his head backward and pursues his intended. The nes is made of weeds and is usually surrounded by water and lined with down. In the nest are from 7 to 15 canvasback eggs and not infrequent of ruddy ducks who by this tech nique relieve themselves of the labors of bringing up some of their offspring. Incubation takes 4 weeks and is the responsibility of the mother bird. There is but one brood a year.
