

der those conditions, For the same reason, you should be cautious in using sources containing all amonia nitrogen for cooseason crops unless you know the specific requirements for the crop he continued. Ammonia changes to nitrate very slowly under cool, damp conditions.

'Many of these accidents involved violations of traffic signs, signals and pavement markings, according to statistics from the Mo tor Vehicles Department," he said, "If these posted warnings had been observed, the accidents might never have happened."
