Combine sugar and cinnamon; add milk and flavorings and stir until sugar is dissolved. Pour into tall glasses and top each with a generous spoonful of ice cream. Serves 6. Cold tangy buttermilk makes an excellent "pick-me-up" between meals. It is refreshing and at the same time offers health giving benefits. To Dress Up Vanilla Ice Cream: 1. Whip some soft peanut butter into vanilla ice cream. Re-freeze.

It's easy to keep on hand and is especially convenient for the person living alone, for small families, and for families where everyone works away from home. Dry milk is handy if you are vacationing away from a good source of fresh milk. It's also a refrigerator space saver since it can be kept on the cupboard shelf and reliquidated as needed.
