3rd District Division Reports 22.4 Miles Road Improvements Completed

Raleigh — During December the State Highway Commission completed 22.4 miles of road improvements in the Third Highway Division, Commissioner Heide Trask reported today.

The third with division headquarters in Wilmington, is composed of Brunswick, New Hanover, Onslow, Pender, Duplin and Sampson counties. C. E. Brown is division engineer; R. V. Biberstein is assistant division engineer. R. A. Ashworth is district engineer in charge of road maintenance in Brunswick, New Hanover, Onslow and Pender while B. Whiteside is district engineer at Clinton in charge of road maintenance in Duplin and Sampson counties.

In New Hanover, Davis Road at Porters Neck was paved for 3.5 miles. The road is 18 feet wide. Contract forces did the work.

In Duplin two sections of road were improved and two bridges built by State forces. Log Cabin Road No. 1 was improved for 1.7 mile and a 24 foot wide bridge was built with a 17 foot span and a creosote substructure and concrete superstructure. Log Cabin Road No. 2 was improved for 1.8 mile and a 24 foot wide bridge with an 18 foot span and a creosote substructure and concrete superstructure was built. Baltic Road north and south was bituminous surface

treated for 4.2 miles by contract forces. It is 18 feet wide. In Sampson, three roads and their lengths were soil surfaced as follows: River Road, 8.3 miles; Jeff Williams Road, 2.5 miles; and extension of Hobbstown and Warsaw Road, 0.4 miles. All the roads are 22 feet wide. State forces did the work. East end of old Warsaw Road was bituminous surface treated for 2 miles by contract forces. It is 18 feet wide.
