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

Farmers Want To Know

BY NICHOLS A. AVERA District Office Manager of the Wilmington Social Security Office

In my first article in this series I told how protection under the oldage and survivors insurance program will become a reality to so many self-employed farmers and ranchers by mid-1956. Today, I want to tell about the responsibilities that go along with this protection and which must be met by every farm or ranch operator who had net earnings of at least \$400 in the calendar year 1955.

If you are self-employed in any kind of agriculture, either alone or in a partnership or joint venture, and had net earnings of at least \$400 in 1955, you are required to report your earnings (up to \$4,200) and pay the 3 per cent social security tax on those earnings for the year. You should report your earnings and remit the social security tax along with your Federal Income tax retur nnot later than April

It may be that you will not owe any Federal income tax for 1955, because of family exemptions. For exple, if your total income for the year is less than \$2,400 you would not owe income tax if you have four exemptions (\$600 each for yourself, your wife, and two children).
