

CHILDREN CAN OPERATE ELECTRIC EQUIPMENT — Learning to assist in the preparation of food for a youngster to learn through feeling, accurate labeling and storage must be taught. It could be explained also that the food in the freezer is only as good as that which goes into it; therefore, the need to examine carefully the items to be frozen.

Teach children to put dishes in the washer so that the water hits them just right. Let them scrape the dishes, too. They can also spoon

in the detergent, shut the door and push the button.

There is no reason why your little daughter of ten can't learn to use an electric mixer and use it properly. First, see that the working surface is the right height. Perhaps she will need to stand on something to raise her to the right height. There is one caution to be stressed. Put beaters in the mixer before plugging it in.

Other pieces of equipment a child can learn to operate are toaster, waffle iron, and grill, range, etc.

Encourage a good clean-up, wash-up and put-away job. Encouragement and praise at this age go a far way to develop interest in kitchen work and food preparation. Help your daughter to keep work standards high.
