nnounced.

VA said the 45,514 applications for guaranty received in the last month of 1955 was 9,660 less than the vember total, a seasonal decline. The December total was 13 per cent below December, 1954 but 91 per cent above December, 1953, 68 er cent above 1952 and 47 per cent

VA also reported it received appraisal applications for 43,457 proposed and existing homes during December, compared with 53,416 for the previous month. Of the December total, 24,892 were for pro-posed homes, compared with 30,-397 for November, and 18,565 were for existing homes, compared with 23,019 for November.

•VA said the December decline in

proposed homes is attributed to both seasonal factors and to the tightened market for GI home mort-

The drop in number of existing homes for which VA received appraisal requests was seasonal —a-bout the same percentage decrease as recorded from November to December in previous years.

TEXT: "Let my heart be sound in thy statutes, that I be not ashamed." Ps. 119:80. Soundness is a word that applies to many phases of life; for instance, when we speak of something that is sound, we think of things that are in "good shape," free from damage, defect, disease or decay. Things that are sound, especially persons, are strong, good, reliable correct, truthful, and honest. There is a crying need for soundness of purpose, soundness of motive, soundness of character in all dealings with

SPIRITUAL SOUNDNESS is a timely topic, and should be a thought provoking challenge to every sincere Christian. There are a number of Scriptural examples of, and injunctions to SPIRITUAL SOUNDNESS; let us observe a few of them:

1. SOUNDNESS OF HEART. The Psalmist, is above text, said "Let heart be sound in thy statutes." The wise man said in Prov. 14:30: my heart be sound in thy statutes." The wise man said in Prov. 14:30: "A sound heart is the life of the flesh; but envy the rottenness of bones." A sound heart is essential, both in a physical and a spiritual sense to good health—physically and spiritually.

2. SOUNDNESS OF MIND: "For God hath not given us the spirit

2. SOUNDNESS OF MIND: "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." 2 Tim. 1:7 A Christian should seek the mind of Christ. "For to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is, life and peace." Rom. 8:6.
3. SOUNDNESS OF SPEECH. Paul, in writing to Titus, urges him to "Shew himself a pattern of good works—shewing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity, and sound speech that cannot be condemned." Titus 2:7-8. Unbridled tongue are used by very peace."

4. SOUNDNESS OF DOCTRINE.
