

Lost Colony To Open At Manteo June 29th.

Manteo, N. C., June 10. The Lost Colony, Paul Green's original symphonic drama, and now the longest running outdoor production in the world, will begin its 17th summer season here in Waterside Theatre at Fort Raleigh National Historic Site on Saturday evening, June 29. There will be performances nightly, except Mondays, through Labor Day eve, September 1.

With a brilliant cast of actors, many of them island natives here, rehearsals began on Monday this week under the overall direction of Burnes Hobgood, head of the drama department of Catawba College.

John Lehman of Raleigh returns to The Lost Colony to direct choreography and Dr. Elwood Keister, director of music at East Carolina College in Greenville will again direct the drama's chorus, which in recent years has won wide acclaim and is this year made up almost entirely of highly trained voices of North Carolina and Virginia residents.

Use Proper Chemical To Control Flies

Cows constantly bothered by flies and other insects simply will not produce as well as those that do not have to spend most of their time fighting these pests, states Marvin Senger, dairy specialist for the N. C. Agricultural Extension Service.

Senger declares that every effort should be made to keep flies off the cows. Controlling flies is one of the most important factors necessary to keep up the summer milk flow, he emphasized.

Producers will need to rely on pyrethrum products for the control of biting flies on their animals giving milk. The use of malathion and diazinon in baits and in residual sprays for the control of house flies in dairies is expected to receive considerable attention this year according to Senger.

He suggests that for more detailed information on how to control flies around the dairy barn contact your local county farm agent.

Changes In Your Social Security

A number of disabled persons in this area who have not filed for the disability freeze or disability payments under the amended Social Security Act may lose their benefit rights entirely if they do not file an application by the end of June, according to Ernest F. Fitzpatrick, manager of the Wilmington Social Security Office.

Fitzpatrick stated that by failing to take steps to protect their rights by June 30, persons under severe disabilities for a long time may suffer more than the loss of monthly disability payments at age 60 they might find that the amount of social security benefits payable to men at age 65, women at age 62, or survivors in case of death, has been substantially reduced or lost entirely. He said that the period in which the individual was disabled and had little or no income will count against him when the time comes to file for retirement or survivors insurance payments.

Fitzpatrick explained that in order to become eligible for disability payments or a disability freeze a worker must be disabled to the extent that he is unable to engage in any substantially gainful work. In addition, he must have performed work covered by the social security law at least five years out of the ten years during the last three years of this period. Fitzpatrick concluded by urging all workers who were disabled more than a year ago to see their social security representative as soon as possible. If they fail to do so before the end of June it may be too late.

Peach Prospects Show Decline

Raleigh, June 10 — Production of 1,300,000 bushels of peaches in N. C. is indicated by reports from growers as of June 1. The current forecast released through the North Carolina Crop Reporting Service is 100,000 bushels below production indicated on May 1, but this year's crop would still be the largest since 1952 when 1,600,000 bushels were produced.

Although most orchards are heavily loaded with fruit, some local damage from hail was reported during the month. Also, the May deep appears to have been heavier than had been anticipated.

Limited harvest of early maturing varieties was under way at the end of May.

For the United States, production of all peaches is forecast at 71,388,000 bushels compared with 69,859,000 bushels produced in 1956.
