... pull that gun and badge' off and let him out of the cell, he would beat him. Cavenaugh weighs about 200 pounds and Dempsey weighs around 135 pounds.
According to Boone, former chief deputy, the trouble between Dempsey and Cavenaugh started about a month ago when Dempsey went to Cavenaugh to serve a claim of delivery. Cavenaugh also is reported to have cursed Dempsey at this time and is said to have commented unfavorably about him since then.
Sheriff Miller said an eye witness, who was in the jail, told him that Dempsey went into another room, pulled off his gun and came back. Cavenaugh told him he would not fight him with his badge on. So Dempsey said he took off his badge and opened the cell door.
Boone told this reporter today that he left the jail and went to his car. When Dempsey did not return, he went back into the jail. About the time he got into the jail, Cavenaugh attacked Dempsey. 'He was getting the best of Dempsey and I did as I thought I was supposed to do, pull Cavenaugh off him,' he said. 'I stopped the fight and put Cavenaugh back in his cell.'
Boone further states that he did what he did in the line of duty. Sometime during the fight, Dempsey blacked Cavenaugh's eye. Dempsey received five or six long scratches. Dempsey has told Sheriff Miller that he did open the cell door and let Cavenaugh out at which time the fight started. Boone said he did not hold Cavenaugh for Dempsey to beat him, as some rumors have said.
Sheriff Miller said the witness to the fight said Boone was standing in the room next to the cells when the affair started.
Boone and Dempsey then left the jail. Later Cavenaugh swore out a warrant against both deputies charging them with assault. The warrants were withdrawn Saturday.
Sheriff Miller said today he had heard that Cavenaugh had been bribed to withdraw the warrant, but he did not believe it because he did not think any such thing as that entered either Boone's or Dempsey's mind. He further stated that the rumor did not say who had bribed Cavenaugh.
Boone said today that he would not be a part of anything like this has been accused of doing. san, non-sectarian, self-supporting and self-governing. Through its program on basic social, economic and political questions, the Federation provides a medium for individual growth and group understanding through which members prepare themselves for and take leadership on local, state, national and now international. Today, the Federation is composed of 3300 clubs in all 48 states, the District of Columbia, Alaska and Hawaii, with over 170,000 members. It is also one of 23 member nations comprising the International Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs.
The International Federation was organized in Geneva, Switzerland, in August, 1930, after definite contacts with business and professional women abroad were established in 1928 when sixty-four members of our National Federation made a Good Will Tour of England.
The North Carolina Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs was organized in June 1919 at a meeting in Charlotte. Miss Julia Alexander, an attorney of Charlotte was our first President. There are now 77 clubs in the North Carolina Federation with the following aims and objectives:
1. To elevate the standards for women in business and the professions.
2. To promote the interests of business and professional women.
3. To bring about a spirit of co-operation among the business and professional women of the United States.
4. To extend opportunities to business and professional women through education along lines of industrial, scientific and vocational activities.
