## State College Answers To Timely Farm Questions

QUESTION: How can I make sure that my barnyard has ample drainage when I pave it?

ANSWER: To insure good drainage, keep the slope to a minimum of one inch to every 10 feet and a maximum of not over one half inch per foot.

QUESTION: What is the best type of hay to feed dairy calves?

ANSWER: Fine-stemmed, leafy legume hay is about the best. It is palatable and has a high content of protein, calcium and vitamins. Also, excellent quality mixed legume grass hay ranks high as a feed for calves.

QUESTION: What are the advantages of the pole type hay feeder I've been hearing about?

ANSWER: One of the most important advantages is the low construction cost of the structure. In addition it requires less labor and machinery for filling. It is easily adapted for semi self feeding of hay, and it needs little upkeep.
